Discretion = Separation

from Impurity, Distinction. 1. The Quality of being Discrete, Separate, Distinct, Unrelated. 2. The Power or Action of Discerning, Deciding judgment. 3. The Freedom or Authority To Make Decisions and Choices. Power to Act on Best Discernment.
