## Of JESUS CHRIST, Conceived By The HOLY SPIRIT

### JESUS WALKS ON THE STORMY SEA TO HIS DISCIPLES

**Matthew 14:22-33** “**And straightway JESUS constrained His disciples to get into a ship, and to go before Him unto the other side, while He Sent the multitudes away.** (**Straightway**: eutheos, yoo-theh'-oce = directly. It was getting dark by now. **JESUS**: Ee-ay-sooce' had just finished feeding the 5,000 Men and their families. **Constrained**: anankazo, an-ang-kad'-zo = to necessitate. **His** (own) **disciples**: math-ay-tes' = Taught or Trained ones. **To get into a Ship**: to walk into a Sailing Vessel. **And go before**: proago, pro-ag'-o = to pierce ahead of **Him unto the other side** of the Sea of Galilee, while **He sent the multitude**: ochlos, okh'-los = Throng. **Away**: dismiss them to their homes towns.

14:23 “**And when He had sent them away, He went up into a Mountain apart to Pray: and when the evening was come, He was there alone.** (**JESUS** often got apart for Prayer, even Climbing Mountains, to be Alone with FATHER GOD, His Source Of Power. Sometimes Praying Late into the night).

14:24 “**But the Ship was now in the Midst of the Sea, Tossed with waves: for the Wind was Contrary:** enantios, en-an-tee'-os = over against, opposite. **Tossed**: basanizo, bas-an-id'-zo = to try, test, toss. (James 1:6 speaks of one being driven by the winds and **tossed**: Agitated) **With waves**: kyma, koo'-mah = billows, large undulating masses of water).

14:25 “**And in the Forth watch of the Night JESUS Went unto them Walking on the Sea.** (Between 3 and 6 AM **JESUS** Comes to them Walking Upon the Stormy Sea).

14:26 “**And when the disciples saw Him walking on the sea, they were troubled, saying, it is a spirit; and they cried out for fear:** phobos = fright. **Walking**: peripateo, per-ee-pat-eh'-o = to tread all around, to walk around. **On the Sea, they were troubled**: tarasso, tar-as'-so = to stir or agitate. These Grown Fishermen were Frightened of what they thought was a spirit: phantasma, fan'-tas-mah = spectre, apparition).

14:27 “**But straightway JESUS Spake unto them, Say-**

**ing, Be of good cheer; it is I; Be not afraid.** (**Straightway** = eutheos, yoo-theh'-oce = immediately, directly. **Be of good Cheer**: tharseo, thar-seh'-o = to have Courage. **JESUS** Knows we humans need to be encouraged in times of doubt and Fear).

14:28 “**And Peter answered Him and said, Lord, it is Thou, bid me come unto Thee on the water.** (**Bid**: keleuo, kel-yoo'-o = To Command. **On**: epi = Upon. **The water**: hydor).

14:29 “**And HE Said, Come.** And when Peter was come down out of the Ship, he Walked on the water, to go to **JESUS.** (By Following **JESUS** Command, Peter Was Able To Walk On Water To **JESUS.** Peter understood the Power of **JESUS** Commands. He had seen **JESUS** Cast Out demons by the Power of **His** Command. **Lord**: kyrios, koo'-ree-os = Supreme In Authority. **Peter came down**: katabaino = descend **out of the Ship**: ploion = Sailing Vessel, **and walked**: peripateo = to walk around. **on the water to JESUS**, at **JESUS** Command. Had Peter stepped down from the Ship without **JESUS** Command, it would have been Assumption, and not **Faith**—which made it **Possible to Walk on Stormy Water Toward JESUS**).

14:30 “**But when he saw the wind boisterous, he was afraid; and beginning to sink, he cried, saying, Lord, save me.** (As long as Peter was Looking At **JESUS**, he was doing fine. **But when he Saw**: blepo = To Look At. **the wind boisterous**: ischyros, is-khoo-ros' = Strong, Forcible. The World often comes against us strong, forceful, getting our eyes off **JESUS our Savior.** **Peter was Afraid**: phobeo = be afraid. As soon as Faith is out of Sight, doubt and Fear sets in. Faith is the opposite of **doubt** which causes Fear. **And beginning**: archomai = commence. **To sink**: katapontizo, kat-ap-on-tid'-zo = go down into the sea, (to plunge down, submerge, drown in the stormy water). **he cried**: krazo = cry out. **Saying, Lord**: kyrios = Supreme In Authority. **Save Me**: Sozo = Deliver, Protect, Preserve Me).

14:31 “And Immediately **JESUS** Stretched Forth His Hand, And Caught him, and said unto him, **O thou of little faith, wherefore didst thou doubt?** (**little faith**: oligopistos = Lacking Confidence In **JESUS** Christ. **doubt**: distazo = to waver... Do we do this in our **Christian Life** sometimes?)

14:32 “And when they were come into the Ship, the wind ceased. (Here, **JESUS** could have stopped the wind, while they were still out on the water, but HE didn’t).

14:33 “Then they that were in the Ship came and Worshipped Him, saying, Of a Truth, Thou Art The **SON** Of **GOD**: The Supreme Divinity. (Worshipped: proskyneo, pros-koo-neh’-o = To kiss the hand towards. (**Kiss The SON Psalm 2:12**. Instead of kissing the golden calves **Ho-sea 13:2-4**). There is no SAVIOR/Deliverer besides... **JESUS CHRIST!**)

Now we will hear from disciple **Mark**, what he remembered of that stormy night at sea: the mistake people make in reading the writings of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John, they think all 4 writers should remember, and say, the same things.

**Mark 6:45-52** “And straightway He constrained His disciples to get into the ship, and to go to the other side before unto Bethsaida, while He sent away the people. (Mark tells us **JESUS** set their destination as **Bethsaida**: so they would be sailing across, from the East Side to the N.W Corner of the Sea of Galilee into the land of Gennesaret... vrs. 53).

6:46 “And when He had sent them away, He departed into a mountain to pray. (It probably took **JESUS** some extra time sending the people home, because so many needed healing as well. **JESUS** loved **His** time in prayer, with **FATHER GOD**. And would always return even more powerfully).

6:47 “And when even was come, the ship was in the midst of the sea, and He alone on the land. (Alone with **GOD** is never really alone, and **JESUS** knew it. But **JESUS** succeeded in sending everyone home).

6:48 “And **He** saw them **toiling** in rowing; for the wind was contrary unto them: and about the fourth watch of the night **He** cometh unto them, walking upon the sea, and would have passed by them. (**Toiling**: basanizo, bas-an-id’-zo = tried, tested, tossed. **Rowing**: elauno, el-ow’-no = to drive or push forward, rowing. Even sailing ships had steering Oars to stay on course. And the wind will blow a

Ship off course, if not Corrected by Oars. **For the wind was contrary**: enantios = over against, opposite. But these winds were so strong, the disciples ship was also probably being pushed off course. And it may have taken **JESUS** time walking on the stormy water out to where they were, probably closer to the N.W. side. So **JESUS** Came walking: peripateo = to tread all around **upon the sea**. in the 4th watch of the night, 3 to 6 am. **And would have Passed by**: parerchomai, par-er’-khomee = to come, to go along. I think **JESUS** expected them to make it across without boarding the ship. Perhaps **He** was training them to be ‘Strong against the Opposition’ of the **winds** of the world).

6:49 “But when they saw **Him** walking upon the sea, they supposed it had been a spirit, and cried out: anakrazo = Screamed out. (Fear weakened them, from their focused goal of crossing over).

6:50 “For they saw **Him**, and were troubled. And immediately **He** talked with them, and saith unto them, **Be of good cheer: it is I; be not afraid**. (**JESUS** Always Spoke directly to the problem. **Fright** tends to weaken a man’s Strength).

6:51 “And He went up unto them into the ship; and the wind ceased: and they were sore amazed in themselves beyond measure, and wondered. (Troubled: tarasso, tar-as’-so = to stir or agitate. Before this **Fear**, yes the Winds and the Waves were Agitated, but now they themselves were. So **JESUS** Went Up Into the ship, and **the wind ceased**: kopazo = to tire out, relax. This battle against **JESUS** and His disciples, had worn the **wind** of opposition, out. The devil could never prevent **JESUS** and **His** disciples from going where **He** wanted to go. **And they were sore**: Exceedingly **Amazed**: existemi, ex-is’-tay-mee = out of wits, astounded, astonished, **be beside themselves, wondered**: thaumazo = Admire, Marvel At. **JESUS** Supernatural Powers Kept Everyone Amazed, because they expected Him to behave in Human Fashion, Not **DIVINE** Fashion).

6:52 “And they considered not the Miracle of the loaves: for their heart was **hardened**: poroo = to Petrify, blind, Callous. (It is ‘fallen human’ to simply harden the heart towards the Divine Actions Of **GOD**, and to Conveniently Forget). — Page 2 of 2.
