## **SEVENTY TIMES SEVEN**

We have already researched ...

Matthew 6:14-15 "For If Ye Forgive Men
Their Trespasses, Your Heavenly Father Will
Also Forgive You: But If Ye Forgive Not
Men Their Trespasses, Neither Will Your Father Forgive Your Trespasses. This is the base of

Matthew 18:21 "Then came Peter to Him, and said, Lord, how oft shall my brother sin against me, and I Forgive him?

<u>18:22</u> "JESUS Saith unto him, I Say Not Unto thee, Until Seven Times: But, <u>Until Seventy Times Seven</u>. (Until = Continuance).

We speed ahead to a Parable in Matthew 18:23-35.

18:32-35 "...I Forgave Thee All That Debt,
Because Thou Desiredst ME, Shouldest Not
Thou Also Have Had Compassion On Thy
Fellow Servant, Even As I Had Pity On Thee?
And His Lord Was Wroth, And Delivered
Him To The Tormentors, Till He Should Pay
All That Was Due Unto Him. So Likewise
Shall My Heavenly Father Do Also Unto You,
If Ye From Your Hearts Forgive Not Every
One His Brother Their Trespasses.

Mark 11:25-26 "And When Ye Stand Praying, Forgive, If Ye Have Ought Against Any: That Your Father Also Which Is In Heaven May Forgive You Your <u>Trespasses</u>. But If Ye Do Not Forgive, Neither Will Your Father Which Is In Heaven Forgive Your <u>Trespasses</u>.

Luke 17:4 "And If He Trespass Against Thee Seven Times In A Day, And Seven Times In A Day Turn Again To Thee, Saying, I Repent; Thou Shalt Forgive Him. (And: kai = Also. If: ean = In Case That. He Trespass: hamartano = Offend, Sin, **Against:** eis = In Reference To, With Regard To. Thee: You. Seven Times In A Day: Between Dawn And Dusk, Or In 24 Hrs. And Seven Times In A Day Turn **Again:** epistrepho, ep-ee-stref'-o = ToTurn Over, Toward, Revert. To Thee, Saying, I Repent: metanoeo = To Have Another Mind, Think Differently, Reconsider, To **Feel Moral Compunction = Deep Regret.** Thou Shalt Forgive: aphiemi, af-ee'-avmee = To Send Or Let Off Or Away. Him. (Or Her). Notice here, he or she turns to you in Repentance. JESUS did not say you forgive them 7 times, if they have not repented first. The 'world' wants forgiveness without repentance. It does not work that way. Repentance is the personal action, in order to receive forgiveness from God or anyone else. If you forgive anyone who has not repented, they may continue sinning against you, and against God, without remorse. If they are not around you, to repent, forgive them anyway. This frees you!
