WHY SO MANY LONELY SINGLES IN THE CHRISTIAN CHURCH?

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TWO ARE BETTER THAN ONE !

ARE SINGLE CHRISTIAN WOMEN 'JOINED' TO COUPLES?

That may sound like a strange question, but sometimes it seems an evident issue for the single Christian men in some mega-churches.

At the beginning of this type of joined relationship, where 'single women seem joined to married couples', it is helpful, for the struggling single girl to find some stability for her Christian life.

It gives her some sense of security and comfort, and helps her battle her loneliness and isolation.

The Christian couple, like parents, can carefully watch closely over 'their daughter', and can seem to protect her from men.

Some may assume that unknown Christian men are a threat to 'their daughter', and soon 'their single daughter' sees these Christian men through this cautious, and self-protective window view.

Christian men can see this tight parent/daughter bond and may not want to interfere with it. A daughter should be 'parented' until mature, and be ready for a relationship of her own.

Then the single Christian lady wonders why some Christian man has not taken an interest in her, as a marriage possibility.

But when single Christian men see that 'the lady is already taken' they are not likely to take much of an interest in her.

When a single Christian man is open to marriage, he looks for a single Christian lady who goes out of her way, even out of her safety zone (her parents covering, or her sister/sister role) to reach out to him.

If she is co-dependent, men can assume that she is not mature enough for relationship and marriage.

Single women have their comfort zones, either with other single women, or hanging out with safe married couples.

This is perfectly fine, as long as they do not want a relationship with a single man, or marriage.

Men will naturally stay away, from both of those tight-bond parent/daughter, or sister/sister circles. They see them as a single lady's priority relationships.

But, just as natural families eventually let their single daughter venture out to relational possibilities, so should Christian married couples encourage 'their single daughters' to look for a Christian man that they can build a relationship with. A marriage with, and then a nest with. And many do!

But as the church helps make single Christian ladies very self-sufficient-self-reliant. A single Christian man may feel that he has little to add to that, and her.

In some mega-churches, the focus is predominately on the needs of women. And from some single Christian man's view, many mega-church women really don't need to get married. These may not want 'to lower themselves to serve' a husband.

A REVOLUTIONARY IDEA:

NOW, let's say that you, a single Christian man, comes to a church, and to your mind boggling amazement, a single Christian lady walks up to you and asks you, "May I treat you to a café mocha?"

And if that didn't cause you a heart attack, you would wonder with great curiosity, "WHO IS THIS LADY?" I've never had this happen to me before? Cause usually I'm the one treating a single lady. Usually single Christian ladies just don't serve single Christian men, this is very unusual, indeed!

But if you are this single Christian lady, you have gotten the attention of this single Christian man! And this interest will have a good chance of continuation. You may even make the single guy to wonder if you were willing to be a 'helpmate' ..spouse?

The mega-church really needs to encourage single Christian ladies to prepare, and present themselves as help-mates to single Christian men!
