



PLANET EARTH DAYS

THE GENERATIONS OF SHEM TO ABRAM

The story continues, with Shem and his descendants. Genesis

11:10 **“These are the generations of Shem: Shem was 100 years old, and begat Arphaxad two years after the Flood.** (again we remember that Japheth was Noah’s Oldest Son, then Shem, 2 years later, then Ham, the youngest son. Shem is mentioned last here because his line leads to Abram or Abraham, called the Father of Faith).

11:11 **“And Shem lived after he begat Arphaxad 500 years, and begat sons and daughters. (Shem 600).**

11:12 **“And Arphaxad lived 35 years and begat Salah: (Sala, Shelach).**

11:13 **“And Arphaxad lived after he begat Salah 403 years and begat sons and daughters. (Arphaxad 438).**

11:14 **“And Salah lived 30 years, and begat Eber: (Eber or abar ‘to cross over’ is the original eponym of the Hebrew people. Arphaxad, Salah (Sala) and Eber (Heber) were in the Lineage of the Christ).**

11:15 **“And Salah lived after he begat Eber**

403 years and begat sons and daughters. (Salah 433).

11:16 **“And Eber lived 34 years, and begat Peleg: (In the days of Peleg the Earth was divided, speaks of the Tower of Babel where Creator Confused the Languages and Scattered the peoples).**

11:17 **“And Eber lived after he begat Peleg 430 years, and begat sons and daughters. (Eber lived 464 years).**

11:18 **“And Peleg lived 30 years, and begat Reu:**

11:19 **“And Peleg lived after he begat Reu 209 years and begat sons and daughters. (Peleg 239).**

11:20-21 **“And Rue lived 230 years, and begat Serug. And Rue lived after he begat Serug 207 years, and begat sons and daughters. (Rue 437).**

11:22-23 **“And Serug lived 30 years, and begat Nahor: And Serug lived after he begat Nahor 200 years, and begat sons and daughters. (Serug 230).**

11:24-25 **“And Nahor lived 29 years, and begat Terah: And Nahor lived after he begat Terah 119 years, and begat sons and daughters. (Nahor 148).**

11:26 **“And Terah lived 70 years, and begat ABRAM, Nahor, and Haran. (Terah was a Caldean Shepherd who lived beyond the Euphrates River and worshipped other gods. Even serving Nimrod and their sun god. He migrated with his family from the Mountains of the North to the plains of Mesopotamia and settled in Ur of the Chaldees where he made Idols for Nimrods 12 chief Astrology gods). See Joshua 24:1-2.**

11:27 **“Now these are the generations of Terah: Terah begat ABRAM, Nahor, and Haran; and Haran begat Lot. (ABRAM ab-rawm’ = High Father. The original name of Abraham. Abram was the 10th Generation from Noah, being a descendant of Shem, who was 390 years by then. By this time Nimrod declared himself god and Tower of Babel would be destroyed**

when Abram was 48. Abram would be 58 years by the time Noah died. Abram learned much from Noah and Even from Methuselah, who knew Adam. Jewish history says that Abram defied Nimrod, the Heathen leader of all the Idol worshippers. Nahor: means Snorting. He has 11 sons and 1 daughter and becomes the progenitor of 12 Aramean tribes. Haran: means mountaineer Jewish history says he was put to death in a furnace, by Nimrod, for siding with Abram, who Worshipped GOD. Lot: means veil, or covering.

11:28 **“And Haran died before his father Terah in the land of his nativity, in Ur of the Chaldees. (Terah was Serving Nimrod, when Nimrod cast Abram into a furnace for Serving GOD. Abram was Saved by GOD. Haran was also cast into the furnace, but died. Because the Chaldeans were Astrologers).**

11:29 **“And Abram and Nahor took them wives: the name of Abram’s wife was Sarai; and the name of Nahor’s wife was Milcah, the daughter of Haran, the father of Milcah, and the father of Iscah. (Iscah: yiskah or Sarai or Sarah. Lot’s Sisters become the wives of their uncles Abram and Nahor. An act of kindness since Haran died young. Milcah: means Queen. She would bear 8 children. She, the Grandmother of Rebekah).**

11:30 **“But Sarai was barren; she had no child. (Jewish History says that Nimrod again became angry against Abram, who had 300 followers who worshipped Creator GOD. They fled to Noah in the Mountains, and later Terah left his post with Nimrod and caught up with them. Abram persuaded his father Terah to give up Idolatry, and go with him to Canaan).**

11:31 **“And Terah took Abram his son, and Lot the son of Haran, and Sarai, and went forth with them from Ur of the Chaldees, to go into the Land of Canaan; and they came to Haran and dwelt there. (here we see Terah was a changed man, and heads north to Haran, which was a caravan post and the commercial crossroads to the land of Canaan.**

11:32 **“And the days of Terah were 205 years: and Terah died in Haran. (he was free of Idolatry and Canaan bound).**
